On Sunday, September 7, 2025, in Rome, Pope Leo canonized Saint Carlo Acutis, an Italian millennial whose deep devotion to the Church — and especially to the Eucharist — continues to inspire people around the world. Carlo attended daily Mass and eagerly served in his parish community. Yet, he was also a typical teenager who loved soccer, computers, and gaming. At just 15 years old, he died of leukemia, but his legacy lives on.



Moreland Notre Dame Celebrates 125 Years!



September 5 & 6, 2025 was a celebratory weekend for Moreland Notre Dame in Watsonville, CA! The festivities began with a beautiful Mass led by Bishop Danny Garcia, followed by a small reception in the library where members of the MND community — past and present — enjoyed memorabilia from the past 125 years and admired the newly reinvigorated library patio.

The celebration continued with a 125th Anniversary dinner hosted by alumni & friends. Sisters, staff, board members and alumni gathered to reminisce while rekindling old friendships and connecting with teachers and administrators. Sister Louise O'Reilly, SNDdeN provided remarks in the anniversary video and many former students (classes of '74 and '75) shared memories of their time in her classroom.

Honoring Heritage and Faith: NDA Worcester Student Portrays St. Kateri in Historic Cathedral Mural

A junior at Notre Dame Academy in Worcester, MA, recently had the extraordinary honor of portraying St. Kateri Tekakwitha in a newly unveiled mural at St. Patrick's Cathedral in New York City. Commissioned by His Eminence Timothy Cardinal Dolan and painted by artist Adam Cvijanovic, the mural, *What's So Funny About Peace, Love, and Understanding*, celebrates the Cathedral's legacy as a


sanctuary for New York's diverse Catholic community, especially immigrants. The expansive work weaves saints, civic leaders, immigrants, and everyday figures into a sacred narrative of faith, resilience, and belonging.

The student, Dana Howling Wolf Keller, is a proud member of the Mandan, Hidatsa, and Arikara Nation (MHA Nation) of North Dakota. Her adoptive parents intentionally preserved her full name to honor her Native heritage and keep her connected to her roots — a connection that makes her portrayal of St. Kateri, the first Native American saint, even more meaningful. Known as the "Lily of the Mohawks," St. Kateri is the patroness of orphans, Native Americans, and the environment.

Dana's likeness now appears alongside other significant Catholic figures such as St. Frances Xavier Cabrini, Dorothy Day, and Venerable Pierre Toussaint. This powerful new work of sacred art invites visitors to reflect on the unity of faith, history, and culture and can now be seen on permanent display inside St. Patrick's Cathedral.



Dana Howling Wolf Keller with renowned artist Adam Cvijanovic. Cvijanovic's mural draws inspiration from the Apparition at Knock (1879), a Marian vision central to Irish Catholicism, reimagining the event as a story of comfort and inclusivity for all immigrants and communities.



Dana's role in this historic artwork carries profound personal meaning. Having spent the first eight years of her life in foster care, she had already chosen St. Kateri as her confirmation name (She will be confirmed on November 1, 2025 at St. Mary's Parish in Shrewsbury)—a decision made before learning she would have the chance to sit for the saint's likeness in the mural. This alignment of faith and opportunity has been described by Dana and her family as nothing short of providential.
